## BISHOP STACY M. MCQUEEN FULL GOSPEL MONUMENT OF FAITH CHURCH

We, the Members of the Newark Municipal Council, would like to take this opportunbity to commend Bishop Stacy M. McQueen, of Full Gospel Monument of Faith Church, located in Newark, New Jersey. Bishop McQueen was born in Moncks Corner, South Carolina, to the late Deacon Wardel and Evangelist Thelma McQueen. He moved with his family to Newark, New Jersey in 1954 and finished his high school education at Central High School. After graduating, he enlisted into the United States Air Force, where he served for more than four years in Texas, Oklahoma and Turkey and was honorable discharged. Upon being discharged from the service, Bishop McQueen worked for the United States Postal Services for a short time. He attended the Newark Deliverance Evangelistic Center, where he accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Lord and Savior in November of 1960 and entered the Ministry full time, soon after, he moved forward into full-time evangelism. A little more than two years later he married Evangelist Ruth Yvonne Hayes. Immediately after their marriage, they evangelized together and pioneered churches in Rock Mount, NC; Baltimore, MD; Seattle, WA; Aliquippa, PA and Full Gospel Monument of Faith, in Newark, New Jersey, where he is Chief Prelate. Bishop McQueen has been pastoring and involved in his local community for over 42 years. He has used his ministry to win souls for the Lord in many ways and has also engaged the community by conducting church service outside in the parking lot. He is also known for his outside tent ministry that was placed on Irvine Turner Boulevard and South Orange Avenue to combat drugs and violence. Annually, Bishop McQueen's ministry gives away school bags and school supplies for needy children; Thanksgiving baskets for up to 50 families; hosts a winter coat drive and a Christmas toy drive. He has sponsored bibles to the island of Haiti through Mother Workmen's Mission and sent supplies to victims of Hurricane Katrina.
