WHEREAS, an emergency has arisen in Special Item of Appropriation in the amount of \$1,024,732.00 bringing total program resources to \$1,562,916.00, for the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program and Zika Prevention Services and no provision has been made in the 2018 Temporary Budget for the aforesaid purpose and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-20 provides for the creation of an emergency appropriation for the purpose above-mentioned; and

WHEREAS, by award letter dated January 30, 2018, from the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services, the City of Newark has been awarded \$1,024,732.00 to provide lead poison prevention services, community outreach and case management for children six (6) months through six (6) years of age within the City of Newark and Zika Prevention Services; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-20 provides that the Governing Body by a two-thirds vote may make temporary emergency appropriations for any purpose for which appropriations may lawfully be made for the period between the beginning of the current fiscal year and the date of the adoption of the budget for said year; and

WHEREAS, emergency appropriation adopted in 2018, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-20 including this resolution total......\$ 75,418,933.15.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, NEW JERSEY, THAT:

1. A temporary emergency appropriation is and the same is hereby made for the following classification:
