**WHEREAS**, an emergency has arisen in the Special Item of Appropriation in the amount of Four Hundred Ninety-Two Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$492,300.00) for the Ryan White HIV/AIDS - Ending the Epidemic (ETE) Program and no adequate provision has been made in the 2022 Temporary Budget for the aforesaid purpose and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-20 provides for the creation of an emergency appropriation for the purpose above-mentioned; and

**WHEREAS**, by Award Letter dated January 19, 2022, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services/Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) awarded the City of Newark funds for the Ryan White HIV/AIDS - Ending the Epidemic (ETE) Program for Four Hundred Ninety-Two Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$492,300.00). The aforementioned program will provide funds for the provision of health care and supportive services to the residents of the City of Newark; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-20 provides that the Governing Body, by a two-thirds vote, may make temporary emergency appropriations for any purpose for which appropriations may lawfully be made for the period between the beginning of the current fiscal year and the date of the adoption of the budget for said year; and

**WHEREAS**, emergency appropriation adopted in 2022, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-20 including this Resolution total.....\$ 155,068,988.88.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, NEW JERSEY, THAT:**

1. The Governing Body by a two-thirds vote of its full membership hereby amends its temporary budget by making the following temporary emergency appropriation:
2. A temporary emergency appropriation be and the same is hereby made for the following classification.

3. Said emergency appropriation is ratified from March 1, 2022 to the date of adoption of this authorizing Resolution.
4. The temporary emergency appropriation shall be provided for in the 2022 budget.
5. A copy of this Resolution shall be filed with the Director of Local Government Services by the City Clerk.

**STATEMENT**

This Resolution establishes the revenue and temporary emergency appropriation for the Ryan White HIV/AIDS - Ending the Epidemic (ETE) Program in the amount of \$492,300.00. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services/Health Resources and Services Administration awarded the funds. The project period is March 1, 2022 through February 28, 2023.
