**WHEREAS,** Ordinance 6PSF-f adopted on May 20, 2015, authorizes the designation of an intersection, etc. for honorary and ceremonial purposes; and

**WHEREAS,** Amiri and Amina Baraka, arguably New Jersey's leading proponents and advocates of Black creative arts and cultural expressions that reflected the rich and diverse experience of African-American in America; and

**WHEREAS,** Amiri and Amina Baraka, who prided themselves on being a forceful advocate of Black Cultural Nationalism, in the vanguard of the revolutionary Black Arts Movement of the 1960's and 1970's,

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, NEW JERSEY, THAT:

- 1. The Municipal Council does hereby authorize the honorary and ceremonial renaming of the intersections of Clinton Avenue and South 10<sup>th</sup> Street and Madison Avenue and South 10<sup>th</sup> Street as "Amiri & Amina Baraka Way".
- 2. The official name of the said streets shall remain Clinton Avenue, South 10<sup>th</sup> Street and Madison Avenue, in their entirety.

## <u>STATEMENT</u>

This Resolution authorizes the naming of the intersections of Clinton Avenue and South 10<sup>th</sup> Street and Madison Avenue and South 10<sup>th</sup> Street as "Amiri & Amina Baraka Way", for honorary and ceremonial purposes.
