Funds accepted by Resolution 7R1-a adopted on February 1, 2017. Budget Insertion by Resolution 7R1-a adopted on March 15, 2017.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 7R1-A, adopted February 1, 2017, the Mayor and/or his designee, the Business Administrator, were authorized to file FY2016 (Program Year 2016-2017) One -Year Action Plan with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), which contained requests for funds from four grant programs: Community Development Block Grants

(CDBG), \$6,402,859.00, HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), \$1,467,895.00, Housing Opportunities for People With AIDS (HOPWA), \$5,807,583.00 (on behalf of Newark and the "Eligible Metropolitan Area") and Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG), \$586,879.00, and were further authorized to accept these grant funds and enter into a grant agreement with HUD for these funds, with no municipal funds required; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the competitive contracting process of the State Local Public Contracts Law, as authorized by N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1b(2) (being the operation, management or administration of a social service program), and pursuant also to the fair and open process of State Pay-to-Play Law N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5, the City of Newark (hereinafter "City") publicly advertised a Request for Proposals (RFP) for homelessness prevention and rapid-rehousing services on July 15, 2016, with all proposals due on August 12, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Council of the City previously authorized the use of competitive contracting for processing these Housing and Urban Development Entitlement Programs and authorized said use for the future; and

WHEREAS, the proposal received from St. James Social Services Corporation, 588 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard, Newark, New Jersey 07102 (hereinafter referred to as "Sub-recipient") was the most advantageous to the City of Newark based on experience and all other criteria listed in the RFP; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Community Wellness desires to enter into a contract with the Sub-recipient, for the purpose of homelessness prevention and rapid-rehousing services for the contract period January 1, 2017, to December 31, 2017, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$35,319.00; and

WHEREAS, this contract awarded to the Sub-recipient is in compliance with Local Public Contracts Law, including but not limited to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1(b) (2) and/or N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5, and Emergency Solutions Grants, 24 CFR 576; and

WHEREAS, the City adopted the "Contractor Pay-to-Play Reform" ordinance, codified at Section 2:4-22C et seq., of the Revised General Ordinances of Newark (hereinafter "Pay-to-Play Reform Ordinance"), which requires reporting of political contributions to candidates for City of Newark elective municipal offices or City or County of Essex political committees and prohibits certain political contributions within one year prior to the date of the contract and prohibits a business entity from making any political contributions from the first communication with the City through the duration of the contract; and

WHEREAS, reporting requirements pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5, et seq. and the Pay-to-Play Reform Ordinance are only applicable to business entities as defined therein and do not include non-profit organizations, and as a non-profit organization, Sub-recipient is therefore not required to submit certain disclosure statements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, NEW JERSEY, THAT:

1. The Mayor and/or his designee, the Interim Director of the Department of Health and Community Wellness, is hereby authorized to enter into and execute a contract with St. James

Social Services Corporation, 588 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard, Newark, New Jersey 07102, for the period January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017, to provide homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing services, which are further described in the "Scope of Services" attached hereto and made a part hereof.

- 2. The Municipal Council hereby ratifies this contract from January 1, 2017, through the date of adoption of this authorizing resolution.
- 3. The total compensation to be paid pursuant to said contract shall not exceed \$35,319.00, and shall be paid for from ESG funding.
- 4. The term of the contract may only be waived or amended in writing and signed by the parties duly authorized to execute this contract, subject to the approval of the Newark Municipal Council by Resolution. The term of this contract may be extended for up to two (2) six-month periods, provided that any such extension is at no additional cost to the City, is authorized by resolution of the Newark Municipal Council, including a finding that the services are being performed in an effective and efficient manner, and is in a writing signed by both parties.
- 5. The Municipal Council ratifies the use of competitive contracting for processing and awarding Housing and Urban Development Entitlement Programs from July 15, 2016, to the date of adoption of this authorizing resolution and authorizes said use in the future.
- 6. This contract is being awarded pursuant to the Emergency Solutions Grants Program, 24 CFR 576.1 et seq., and is in compliance with the fair and open procedures of the State Pay-to-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5, State Local Public Contracts Law, including but not limited to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1(b)(2) and/or N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5, and the City's Pay-to-Play Reform Ordinance.
- 7. Attached hereto is a Certification of Funds from the Municipal Comptroller of the City of Newark, which states that there are sufficient funds for the purpose set forth hereinabove. Business Unit NW051, Dept. G17, Div./Proj. 2H7D0, Account# 72030, Budget B2017.
- 8. An executed copy of said contract shall be filed with the Office of the City Clerk by the Interim Director of the Department of Health and Community Wellness for the City of Newark.

STATEMENT

This resolution authorizes and ratifies the actions taken by the Mayor and/or his designee, the Interim Director of the Department of Health and Community Wellness, to enter into and execute a contract with St. James Social Services Corporation, 588 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard, Newark, New Jersey 07102, utilizing ESG funding, for the provision of homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing services for the period January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017, in an amount not to exceed Thirty-Five Thousand Three Hundred and Nineteen Dollars and Zero Cents (\$35,319.00).
