WHEREAS, the City of Newark desires to continue to provide HIV/AIDS healthcare, supportive and related services to infected and affected residents of the Newark Eligible Metropolitan Area (EMA) which is comprised of Essex, Union, Morris, Sussex and Warren Counties; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 7R5-A adopted on February 16, 2022, the Municipal Council of the City of Newark authorized the Mayor and the Director of the Department of Health and Community Wellness to apply for funds from the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), 5600 Fishers Lane, Rockville, Maryland 20857, pursuant to the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension Act of 2009, for the provision of HIV/AIDS healthcare, supportive and related services to infected individuals and their families in the Newark Eligible Metropolitan Area (EMA); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 7R5-A adopted on February 16, 2022, the Municipal Council authorized the Mayor and the Director of the Department of Health and Community Wellness to accept funds in the amount of Eight Million, One Hundred Thirty- Eight Thousand, One Hundred Seventy-Three Dollars and Zero Cents (\$8,138,173.00), from HRSA through the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension Act of 2009; and

WHEREAS, the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension Act of 2009 requires that the City of Newark, which is the lead agency for the Newark EMA, provide funding for HIV/AIDS related health and support services for people living with HIV and AIDS in the Newark Eligible Metropolitan Area (EMA); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to this requirement, the City of Newark established the Newark EMA Ryan White Continuum of Care; and

WHEREAS, the City of Newark through the Department of Health and Community Wellness, Division of Health Planning/Ryan White Unit, publicly advertised the FY2022 multi-year Request for Proposals (RFPs) for medical and social services, quality management and other professional services ("Ryan White eligible services") from October 20, 2021 through October 22, 2021, and received thirty-seven (37) proposals on November 19, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the funder HRSA/HIV AIDS Bureau has transitioned the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program (RWHAP) from an annual competitive application program to a three-year funded program effective FY2022, the City of Newark RWHAP has shifted to a three-year performance period commencing on March 1, 2022 and terminating on February 28, 2025 in alignment with the funder; and

WHEREAS, Sub-Recipients will submit non-competing continuation (NCC) progress reports and budget documents for contract years two (FY2023) and three (FY2024) in lieu of a competitive application which is subject to availability and appropriation annually of sufficient funds to meet the extended obligation; and

WHEREAS, the evaluation score from the subjective (internal) and objective (external) proposal review process for applications submitted in year one of the performance period will be utilized to award sub-recipients in the second and third years providing there is funding from HRSA. In addition, the HIV Planning Council completes its annual Priority Setting and Resource Allocation processes, and Sub-Recipient contract performance for FY2022 meets requirements for funding; and

WHEREAS, the City's legal notice and RFP for FY2022 Ryan White eligible services was filed with Resolution 7R5-A adopted on February 16, 2022, which authorized the application and acceptance of grant funding for the continued provision of Ryan White eligible services; and

WHEREAS, the proposal submitted by Newark Beth Israel Medical Center and Children's Hospital, 201 Lyons Avenue, Newark, New Jersey 07112 (hereinafter referred to as "Sub-Recipient"), was determined to be most advantageous to the City of Newark, based on experience and criteria listed in the RFP; and

WHEREAS, the Sub-Recipient has demonstrated that they have the expertise to provide HIV related health and support services to meet this requirement; and

WHEREAS, the City of Newark, Department of Health and Community Wellness, desires to enter into an Agreement with the Sub-Recipient to provide Ryan White eligible services to the Newark EMA, which is more specifically described in the "Scope of Services" (attached hereto and made a part hereof) for the period commencing on March 1, 2022 and terminating on February 28, 2025, for a partial award amount of Two Hundred Nine Thousand, Two Hundred Ninety-Six Dollars and Zero Cents (\$209,296.00) and a contract not to exceed Five Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand, Five Hundred Eighty-Nine Dollars and Zero Cents (\$534,589.00) for FY (2022); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Director of the Department of Health and Community Wellness desire to accept additional funds as they may become available from HRSA under the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension Act of 2009; and

WHEREAS, the City of Newark, Department of Health and Community Wellness shall, upon receipt of additional funding, file an amending resolution reflecting the final award amount of each Sub-Recipient, accompanied with a copy of the Notice to Proceed/Award Letter and Certification of Funds; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1995 requires that all Sub-Recipients complete a formalized Business Associate Agreement to protect clients health information and insure the privacy of that information; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement is being awarded pursuant to the fair and open procedures of State Pay-to-Play Law (N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5) and in compliance with the City' Ordinance on Pay-to-Play, R.O. 2:4-22C; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement is being awarded pursuant to State Local Public Contracts Law, including N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1(b)(2) and/or N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5 and/or as a Professional Service pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(1)(a)(i) (where applicable), and the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension Act of 2009.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, NEW JERSEY, THAT:

 The Mayor and/or his designee, the Director of the Department of Health and Community Wellness, are hereby authorized to enter into and execute an Agreement with Newark Beth Israel Medical Center and Children's Hospital, 201 Lyons Avenue, Newark, New Jersey 07112, for the provision of Ryan White eligible services to the Newark EMA, which is more specifically described in the "Scope of Services" attached hereto and made a part hereof, for the period commencing on for the period commencing on March 1, 2022 and terminating on February 28, 2025, for a partial award amount of Two Hundred Nine Thousand, Two Hundred Ninety-Six Dollars and Zero Cents (\$209,296.00) and a contract not to exceed Five Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand, Five Hundred Eighty-Nine Dollars and Zero Cents (\$534,589.00) for FY (2022).

- 2. The Mayor and/or his designee, the Director of the Department of Health and Community Wellness, are hereby authorized to accept and expend additional funds as they become available from the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration, pursuant to the Ryan White Treatment Extension Act of 2009, for the period commencing on March 1, 2022 and terminating on February 28, 2023.
- 3. Attached hereto is a partial Certification of Funds in the amount of Two Hundred Nine Thousand, Two Hundred Ninety-Six Dollars and Zero Cents (\$209,296.00) from the Municipal Comptroller of the City of Newark and that the line appropriation of the official budget which shall be charged is Business Unit 051; Dept. ID G22; Division 2H22C; Account# 72090; Budget Ref. B2022.
- 4. The City of Newark, Department of Health and Community Wellness, shall file an Amending Resolution upon receipt of the additional funds, which shall state the contract amount for each Sub-Recipient and/or Vendor accompanied with the Notice to Proceed and the Certification of Funds.
- 5. The Municipal Council of the City of Newark hereby ratifies the use of competitive contracting for processing agreements under the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension Act of 2009 from October 20, 2021 to the date of adoption and authorizes its use in the future.
- 6. This Agreement is hereby ratified from March 1, 2022 through the date of adoption of this authorizing resolution.
- 7. The Sub-Recipient shall not proceed with the provision of any services beyond the twelve (12) month period of March 1, 2022 and terminating on February 28, 2023 until the issuance of a Notice to Proceed/Award Letter by the Director of the Department of Health and Community Wellness. Sub-Recipients and Vendors will submit non-competing continuation (NCC) progress reports and budget documents for contract years two (FY2023) and three (FY2024) in lieu of a competitive application which is subject to availability and appropriation annually of sufficient funds to meet the extended obligation, subject to Municipal Council approval.
- 8. The Sub-Recipient shall execute and formalize a Business Associate Agreement with the City of Newark to protect clients' health information and ensure the privacy of that information, in accordance with the Federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1995 (a copy is attached hereto).
- 9. This Agreement was procured and awarded pursuant to the fair and open procedures of the State Pay-to-Play Law (N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5), State Local Public Contracts Law, including N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1(b)(2) and/or N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5 and/or as a Professional Service pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(1)(a)(i) (where applicable), the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment

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Extension Act of 2009, and is in compliance with the City's Ordinance on Pay-to-Play, R.O. 2:4 -22C.

- 10. The legal notice/advertisement and RFP for FY2022 Ryan White eligible services shall be filed with Resolution 7R5-A adopted on February 16, 2022.
- 11. The Director of the Department of Health and Community Wellness shall file a fully executed copy of said Agreement with the Office of the City Clerk.
