WHEREAS, an emergency has arisen in Special Item of Appropriation in the amount of \$10,030,400.00, for the HIV Emergency Relief Program and no adequate provision has been made in the 2015 Temporary Budget for the aforesaid purpose and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-20 provides for the creation of an emergency appropriation for the purpose above-mentioned; and

WHEREAS, by award letter dated February 9, 2015, from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services/Health Resources and Services Administration, the City of Newark has been awarded the HIV Emergency Relief Grant in the amount of \$10,030,400.00 for the provision of health care and supportive services to the residents of the City of Newark; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-20 provides that the Governing Body by a two-thirds vote may make temporary emergency appropriations for any purpose for which appropriations may lawfully be made for the period between the beginning of the current fiscal year and the date of the adoption of the budget for said year; and

WHEREAS, emergency appropriation adopted in 2015, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A: 4-20 including this resolution total......\$107,588,360.23.
